Hourly Bus Trips To Library Asked

Brentwood Coach Company Plea Opposed by Railways at Hearing

"Hourly bus service between Pittsburgh and Library, by way of Brentwood, Baptist Road and South Park, will be established if the Public Service Commission grants a permit sought by the Brentwood Motor Coach Company.

Many residents of the district south of Brentwood told Examiner W.E. Best, in a hearing yesterday, that such service is needed, and that there is no other transportation service on Baptist Road.


The route would be an extension of the company's present route between the city and Brentwood. Fare rates, President D.L. Feick of the company said, would range from 5 cents to 35 cents, according to distance, with a 30-cent fare to South Park and 35 cents to Library. The Pittsburgh Railways Motor Coach Company opposed the application."

"Miss Margaret Thompson McMaster and David Kirk Orr were united in marriage at the home of the bride, Broughton, Pa, at noon Tuesday last. The ceremony was performed by Rev. David McAllister, pastor of the Reformed Presbyterian Church of Pittsburg. The home was beautifully decorated for the occasion with potted plants, palms, and flowers. The bride wore a gown of white silk under white organdie and carried a bouquet of lilies of the valley."

James Wilson



"James Wilson, aged 84, one of the oldest and most prominent residents of Snowden Township, died at his home, "Willow Brook Farm," near Bruceton, Pa. He was born January 5, 1823, on the farm on which he died. He was of colonial ancestry, his grandfather having fought in the revolutionary war. Mr. Wilson held many township offices and at one time was supervisor and assessor of the township. He was one of the founders and ruling elders of the Bethel Presbyterian Church. He was twice married, his first wife being Miss Mary Johnston. He leaves his widow, Mrs. Sarah Wilson (nee Blair), five children, 16 grandchildren, and two greatgrandchildren. Funeral services will be held at his residence this morning at 10 o'clock and later at the Bethel Presbyterian Church."
